The next stop on my journey took me to Rollins College in Winter Park, Florida, where I played collegiate golf. It was the combination of gaining tournament experience and learning important life lessons from my coach Julie Garner that solidified my decision that golf would be a part of my life beyond school.

After four years of professional golf, I made the tough, yet crucial decision to move from fulltime tour professional to a teaching professional. I joined the staff at Baltimore Country Club and became a PGA Class A Professional by June of 2017. From the start, the staff at the club and the membership could not have been more supportive of my desire to continue playing in professional events. In my current role as Assistant Director of Instruction and Junior Golf Coordinator, I am responsible for giving private lessons and organizing golf schools. Also, I oversee the junior program, play with members and represent the club in PGA and LPGA tournaments. The stability and happiness I have experienced in this new role have turned out to be the perfect formula to playing elite-level golf. I qualified for the 2018 and 2019 KPMG Women's PGA Championship, the 2019 PGA Professional Championship and several other national PGA and LPGA tournaments. I also captured the 2019 PGA Women's-Stroke Play Championship in dramatic fashion at PGA Club after shooting a tournament-record 64 in the second round.

I am thrilled to share my love for the game of golf with the membership at Baltimore and other people. Thanks to programs like **Women Golfers Give Back**, I received the jump-start I needed for a fulfilling career in the golf industry.



The 8th Annual High School Girls Golf Classic 18-hole event held at Linfield National was another success. The skies were gray which helped the temperatures stay pleasant and the rain held off, making for a delightful day. Seventy girls and ten teams representing 18 different high schools participated to play competitive golf - several girls played as individuals if their school did not have at least 4 girls to form a team. Tee gift bags were also a hit as they included tee shirt, golf balls, a poker chip and some snacks if needed during the round. Dinner after the round was delicious but quick since darkness was arriving and many had long drives home.

The individual medalist honors went to Sarah Scarpill from Central Bucks East shooting an even- par 71. Second place individual honors (decided in a matching of cards) went to Ava O'Sullivan from Downingtown East with a one-over-par 72. Third place individual honors (also with 72) went to Claire Gimpel from Mount St. Joe's.

The top finishing team with a 332 total went to Mount St. Joe's. The second place team award went to Central Dauphin with a 351 total. The third place team award went to Downingtown East with a 353 total.



Peggy Kirk Bell Girls Golf Tour Expands to the Delaware Valley

Providing exclusive opportunities for WGGB players program girls to compete in all-girls' tournaments

The PKBGGT, short for The Peggy Kirk Bell Girls Golf Tour, was founded in 2007 by the Triad Youth Golf Foundation, a non-profit 501(c)(3) charitable organization, as a local girls' golf tour in the Triad region of North Carolina. The tour began as a simple concept: create more effective competitive playing opportunities for girls. By utilizing innovative yardage-based divisions instead of the traditional age-based format, the tour focused on developing tournament experience at the player's pace. The PKBGT is the largest girls-only tour in the country.

This past May, in partnership with Women Golfers Give Back, the Peggy Kirk Bell Girls Golf Tour introduced a brand new, girls-only tournament series for players in the Delaware Valley. The series, designed to provide a welcoming, non-intimidating tournament experience for girls ages 9-18, featured five one-day events with a series finale at Raven's Claw Golf Club, the host of the LPGA Symetra Tour's Valley Forge Invitational.

"Our expansion into the Delaware Valley would not have been possible without the generosity of our series partner, Women Golfers Give Back," says Emily Brooks, PKBGGT Associate Director of Development. The PKBGGT regional series is designed exclusively for players from surrounding WGGB sponsored programs. The aspiring junior golfers who competed in all the regional series gained invaluable tournament experience. WGGB is also very instrumental in helping the girls take the next step towards their dream of playing at the collegiate level.

Golf Motivated Olivia Through the Hardest Moments of Her Life

O livia Steinbach started her golf career at age seven with Coach Cathy Reynolds. She enjoyed the positive atmosphere of the game, and the energy from her coaches. At the same age, she tried soccer, softball, and a few other activities, but she always came back to golf. Winter, spring, summer and fall, Olivia consistently signed up for as many sessions as her calendar would allow.

Around the same time she began to play golf, she was diagnosed with Juvenile Scoliosis. She had to wear a Wilmington brace for 20 hours a day. While she enjoyed her four hours of freedom each day, the curve in her spine made cult for her than others

golf a smidge more difficult for her than others.

In the spring of 2018, it was determined that Olivia's curve had progressed much further and would need to be corrected by a spinal fusion. Understandably, she was scared to have the surgery, however she was most upset and disappointed to miss her favorite outing at French Creek.

On July 18, 2019 Olivia underwent a spinal fusion. This corrected her 72-degree curve of her spine to practically zero degrees. On September 24, she was back at work with coach Cathy at Ingleside. Olivia had to find her new swing. She worked tirelessly through the winter season with Coach Cathy. Coach commented that after the surgery Olivia found it easier to execute the golf swing.

Girls' Golf motivated Olivia through the hardest moments of her life. Returning to the course was a goal she set, and she more than successfully attained it. Only one year after her surgery, Olivia is a proud member of the Downington East High School golf team.
