## Three WGGB Grantees Named J. Wood Platt Scholars

Women Golfers Give Back is proud to share that three of our grantees have been awarded scholarships from the **J. Wood Platt Caddie Scholarship Trust**, one of the most respected scholarship programs in golf.

Founded in 1958 by the Golf Association of Philadelphia, the Trust honors Philadelphia's premier golfer of the era, J. Wood Platt, who was also its co-founder and first contributor. In the last 60+ years, more than 4,000 young men and women have received over \$28 million in scholarships to support college tuition and housing.



This year, WGGB grantees among the recipients include:

- Charli Jones (Walnut Lane Golf Club) A rising junior at Howard University, Charli has been involved with First Tee - Greater Philadelphia for more than 10 years and has participated in WGGB's Merion outings.
- Emily Mayo (Wilmington Country Club) An incoming Penn State freshman and First Tee - Delaware grantee, Emily was featured in our 2024 newsletter for her caddying experience with the Chairman of the 2022 BMW Championship and his BMW Pro-Am group with Rory McIlory.
- Caitlyn Plover (Whitemarsh Valley Country Club) Headed to Loyola University this fall, Caitlyn first joined WGGB's Girls Golf Clinics at age seven, and by 12, she had created the idea for a Girls' Golf Tournament and Fashion Show, which became an annual fundraising event for First Tee -Greater Philadelphia and a lasting legacy of her leadership.

We congratulate Charli, Emily, and Caitlyn for this recognition and look forward to following their continued success on and off the course.

Thank you for your continued commitment to Women Golfers Give Back. It is an honor to provide girls the experience of golf — something made possible by your support.

WGGB's mission to enrich girls' lives through golf is simple yet powerful. Every initiative we undertake provides access to programs that teach golf skills, foster connection, and build leadership and character in girls who might not otherwise have the opportunity.



Thanks to our community's shared purpose, WGGB has granted \$2.5 million to girls' golf programs over the past 22 years. In 2025, we recorded our largest giving year to date, awarding \$180,000 to 8 players programs, 10 clinic programs, and 2 scholarships. These achievements belong to all of us — and especially to you.

## A Season to Remember for LPGA-USGA Girls Golf of Valley Forge BY SUSAN TALL BOARD MEMBER, LPGA-USGA GIRLS GOLF OF VALLEY FORGE



What a season it's been for Girls Golf of Valley Forge! Our clinics for girls 7-18 years old have been full of energy, growth, and fun. This season, we scheduled 60 clinics. Each week, we host sessions for beginners in three age groups—7-9, 10-13, and 14-17—along

with an "on the course" play clinic for experienced players. Each hour-long clinic welcomes 20+ girls who rotate through putting, chipping, and swing mechanics. In addition, there are occasional contests for Closest to the Hole and Inside the Ring! With three pros instructing each week, our 1:7 teaching ratio ensures every girl gets focused attention. Lead pro Tony DeGisi has been with the program from the very beginning. Even on the hottest days, Spring Ford's

giant sycamore tree provided the perfect shady spot for all the girls to gather!

The demand has taken us by surprise-every clinic has sold out, with waiting lists forming each week. To support this growth, we purchased new clubs in multiple lengths, which players can rent at a very modest price. Each player has the ability to exchange their clubs as they go through the typical growth spurts.

We are so grateful to Women Golfers Give Back for funding professional teaching fees, clinic polo shirts, and snacks. Without their generous assistance we would not be able to host such a wonderful experience for young women golfers. A special thank you also goes to Spring Ford Country Club for donating 3 hours of Practice Range time each week and access to their putting and chipping practice areas. We have been blessed to have such great partners!



### Breaking Records, Broadening Our Impact

WGGB was thrilled to grant a record **\$180,000** this year to golf programs that will support hundreds of girls!! Thank you to the generous support of our donors, sponsors and friends for making this possible.

In 2025, we also welcomed five new grantees. First Tee - Jersey Shore and First Tee - Greater Philadelphia launched Players Programs with WGGB's support.

We've also expanded further into the Lehigh Valley and Western PA by providing grants to two new Clinic Programs through Girls Golf Lehigh Valley, Girls Golf of Western Lehigh Valley and the Women's Golf Association of Western Pennsylvania. And we are thrilled to support the empowHERed scholarship helping introduce women and girls to golf.

We're especially excited to recognize **Skylar Crutchfield**, age 8, from First Tee – Greater Philadelphia. Many of you may remember Skylar as our putting contest ringer at the June WGGB fundraising tournament. Despite her young age, Skylar has already made her mark in the game, advancing to the Regional Drive, Chip & Putt competition in 2024.

She is joined in this year's scholarship class by more young female golfers: **Finley Campbell** (West Chester, Pa.), **Elizabeth George** (South Abington Township, Pa.), and **Rogan Knapp** (Williamstown, N.J.).

This year's program is supported by Women Golfers Give Back and the Valley Forge Tourism & Convention Board, with golf equipment provided by the Philadelphia Cricket Club's 1854 Foundation.

Upon receiving this year's WGGB grant, Courtney Curcio, PGA REACH Philadelphia Director, shared:

### Teeing Up Confidence and Connection at Oakmont

One of Women Golfers Give Back's new grantees in 2025 is the **Women's Golf Association of Western Pennsylvania (WGAWP)**. The organization applied for a grant to support Junior Girls Golf Clinic scholarships for girls from underserved communities who lack access to private instruction and demonstrate financial need.

Founded in 1922, WGAWP promotes the best interests and true spirit of the game while governing competitions for its 600 members across 38 clubs. For junior girls, WGAWP provides mentoring, instruction, and opportunities to compete.

WGAWP's **Carol Semple Thompson Junior Girls Golf Clinic** creates an inclusive and welcoming environment for approximately 88–90 girls ages 5–17 from the Pittsburgh area. The goal is to introduce girls to golf, register them on GHIN, and build long-term relationships that connect them to WGAWP Junior Amateur competitions. The clinic emphasizes a safe, engaging setting where participants not only build athletic skills but also gain life lessons and friendships.

Held at Oakmont Country Club for the past decade, the clinic features 12–15 PGA professionals and certified

coaches, including **Carol Semple Thompson** herself, one of the most celebrated amateur golfers of all time. In partnership with the local **First Tee** program and area schools, WGAWP provides scholarships to girls who cannot afford the clinic fee and WGGB was proud to support those scholarships in 2025.

**Annie VanZant**, president of PA Golf, reflected on the experience: "The girls enjoyed the instruction, being at Oakmont just weeks before the U.S. Open, seeing all the tents and excitement, experiencing the history and tradition inside the clubhouse—along with lots of smiles and giggles."

WGAWP Vice President **Katie Miller Gee** shared a similar sentiment, "The day was an incredible success. Everything ran perfectly, and the response from both the girls and their parents was overwhelmingly positive. Many shared how meaningful it was to have an opportunity like this made possible through your generosity. My favorite note came from a mom who said, 'Addi texted me during the event asking, when is this over? Because I don't want it to end!'"

## Mentorship in Motion at Merion Golf Club

Our **Top Players Program** grantees showcased impressive skills on the course—from swing to finish, they nailed it—but it was their uplifting support for one another that truly stood out at this year's **Mentor Day Outing at Merion Golf Club**.
